The President opened the meeting at 09.00 and welcomed the members of the Bureau and observers. He read the email sent by CIAM Secretary that he was not possible to attend the Bureau Meeting due to business commitments.

The FAI Sports and Events Director, Mr Markus Haggene, attended the meeting and made an introductory speech.

The CIAM President appreciated the excellent cooperation CIAM has with FAI HO and in particular with the FAI Secretary General and the FAI Sports and Events Director and of course all the staff.

Meetings Procedurals

1. Agenda Review

No comments were received so the Agenda will be discussed as distributed.

2. Minutes of the December 2017 Bureau meeting

No comments/remarks were offered and the Minutes were accepted.

3. Schedule of Plenary Meeting, Technical Meetings and Awards Presentation Ceremony

The CIAM President displayed on the screen the presentation prepared by Secretary, Mr Massimo Semoli, who due to business commitments was absent, for review by the CIAM Bureau.

The Technical Meetings' locations were assigned but they can be adjusted later in accordance with the number of attendees for each meeting. For the time being, 80 persons have been registered from a total of 35 countries with 4 proxies.

4. CIAM Bureau and S/C chairmen nominations and elections

All the CIAM officers declared that they will be available for re-election. F1, F3, Aerobatics, F3 Soaring and F3 Pylon Racing S/C Chairmen confirmed that they will go on.

The F4 and the SM S/C chairmen declared that they will not stand up for re-election. The rest mentioned that they will be available.

It was agreed that each of the new candidates will have 2 minutes for presenting themselves.

5. Open Forum about "Marketing Aeromodelling Events"

The section will be presented by the FAI President and FAI Marketing Consultant Mr. Tony Webb, by the use of PowerPoint presentations.

6. Date for 2018 December Bureau meeting. Dates for 2019 Bureau and Plenary meetings

Bureau Meeting: The December Bureau meeting will take place at Ankara on the 30th of November and 1th December 2018. The Plenary meeting dates will be notified by FAI. No offers arrived for other locations where the 2019 Plenary Meeting might be held. So Lausanne will be the location.

WAG 2020 & TWG 2021

7. WAG 2020 in Turkey

7.1 General Considerations. The FAI Events and Sports Director Mr. Markus Haggene announced that FAI EB decided to award the WAG for 2020 to Turkey. He then presented a Power Point presentation on the subject giving a general overview of the full project. Some extra information was provided for the aeromodelling events that they will be hosted in Ankara. He mentioned that tomorrow during the Plenary Meeting the delegation from Turkey will be present and they will be ready to present the details of this event and also to answer any possible questions from the delegates.

There were few questions from the Bureau members. Bruno Delor mentioned that the concept to be followed for the WAG is not in line with the decisions and the conclusions of the workshop which was conducted few months after the WAG in Dubai. Tomas Bartovsky referred to the 1997 WAG which happened the same way as it is planned for 2020.

7.2 CIAM Disciplines. CIAM president mentioned that a workshop with the organizers took place the day before the Bureau meeting and the initial list of events is exactly as it was in Dubai but with Drones Sports as addition. This workshop was attended by Narve Jansen, CIAM appointed liaison, Bruno Delor and CIAM President.

7.3 Actions. Since the aeromodelling events will take place in Ankara and no other FAI airport will be organized there, it is an opportunity to include more events on the program. There were some proposals from Per Findahl who was in favour to include Hand Launched gliders to the list and the President asked all the S/C chairmen to provide their ideas in written till beginning of June since at the end of June there is going to be a meeting in Ankara with the organizers. It was also decided that after the meeting there are going to be discussions between CIAM and organizers, including of course FAI HO, so to be able to arrive to solid conclusions before the end of this year. Those conclusions will turn to be decision during the Bureau meeting in Ankara and then the final decision will be announced to the FAI members. The final decision will include not only the disciplines but also the selection criteria for each class. CIAM President asked Education S/C chairman to consider the possibilities to be part of the WAG with some educational programs for all CIAM disciplines.

8. TWG 2021 – Birmingham USA

FAI Sports and Events Director Mr. Haggenev announced that the plans for this prestigious event are including 2 airports. Canopy Piloting from Parachuting and Drones Racing from Aeromodelling. CIAM President mentioned that this is a very promising development for this activity and it will be a very good opportunity to further promotion. Mr. Delor expressed his satisfaction and he is sure that the FPV S/C will fully support this event.

10. CIAM Flyer Status Report. Emil Giezendanner, Editor

The CIAM President thanked Mr Giezendanner for his continued excellent work on the CIAM Flyer.

11. CIAM Treasurer's Report:

11.1 2018 Budget

Income and Expenditure are in the report annexed to the Plenary Meeting Agenda.

The Championships medals are available for many years since we order them every year.

The World Cup medals are sufficient for this year but for the next we will need to place an order. It was decided to ask former President Mr. Pimenoff to provide a quotation from the supplier in Finland and in the meantime there will be a research on the market to look for alternative solution and possible better pricing. The Bureau decided to delegate Mr. Andras Ree to work together with the President and decide about the best available solution for the next order.

11.2 2018 Budget Proposal

It was presented on the screen. There were no comments.

11.3 Any other

The CIAM Treasurer will send his report to the delegates before the beginning of the Plenary Meeting. CIAM President mentioned about the case that CIAM will have to contribute for the development of some software which will assist not only CIAM but also the head office to handle better cases like the Annual calendar and the

Judges/Technical Experts.

12. Sporting Code. Report by the Technical Secretary

It is a huge task and the 90 pages of proposals were sent in due time for the Plenary Meeting agenda.

13. Scholarship Selection

Mr Findhal presented the analysis and the voting for the five candidates for the 2018 CIAM Scholarship. Mr Findhal was pleased to announce that the recommended candidate for 2018 was Michail LOMOV (Russia).

The Bureau accepted the proposal and the Plenary Meeting will be asked to approve the selection.

14. FAI Medals status

As Mr. Ree informed for this year we don't have missing payments for medals as it used to be in the previous year. He also informed the Bureau members that the World Cup medals stock is not enough for next year and that we will have to order a new batch. It was decided to ask quotation from the former President Mr. Sandy Pimenoff and also the President mentioned that he is also going to look for a second option. The Bureau appointed Mr. Ree to work with CIAM President and choose the best option.

Sporting Calendar

15. Contest Calendar.

There is nothing special to report in general for this matter. There is not any reported modification.

15.1 2018 World and Continental Championships.

The CIAM President showed the status of the 2018 championships on the screen as prepared by CIAM Secretary.

15.2 2019 and Future World and Continental Championships.

The CIAM President showed the status of the championships up to 2022 on the screen as prepared by CIAM Secretary.

Championships bids issue

As occurred last year, some NACs provided late, after the due date (45 days before the Plenary Meeting), the necessary documents for participating in the 2019 and 2020 FAI Championships bidding process at this year's Plenary Meeting.

After discussion, it was agreed that:

- the NACs with documentation received after the deadline cannot be included in the process if other NACs which submitted documentation on time are bidding.
- when NACs with late documentation are the only bidders and are checked as recommended by the relevant Subcommittee Chairman, the approval to allow the bids to proceed, will be given by vote by the Plenary.

15.3 Bulletin – 0 Approvals for 2019 Events organised between January and April (if any).

One championship will be organised early next year: 2019 FAI F3P WCh in Greece.

CIAM President mentioned that the Bulletin 0 is ready but it is better to wait the decision of the Plenary for the F3P AFM sub-class. This way the Bulletin 0 will not have to be modified after the Plenary. The Bulletin will be ready in May to be approved by the Bureau by using email communication. F3 Aerobatic S/C chairman accepted this procedure. Bureau approved the proposal.

16 Plenary Meeting Agenda and Sporting Code Proposals

The CIAM President saw that a lot of proposals are referring to the same article of the Sporting Code mainly in free flight and space models proposals. He asked the technical meetings to make recommendations and combine the proposals.

17 Review of Bureau Proposals

17.1 Plenary Agenda Bureau Proposals

The following amendments were decided by the Bureau and they will be discussed during

Agenda item g) C.9 Judges Lists

Bureau

Add additional sub-paragraphs b), c) and d) and renumber the existing b) and c) paragraphs as follows:

a) Nominations for persons to be put on the list of international judges must be received by the FAI Office no later than 15th November. The nominations are valid for two years starting the following January and can be updated annually. If no list is returned by the deadline in any year, then the old one stands for one more year. Judges shall be chosen from the list. ~~Any judges appointed for a championship must be on the list when selected.~~ The nominations may be submitted on paper, by email or by using the on-line submission procedure available on the FAI web site.

b) Any judges appointed for a championship must be on the current or upcoming list at the time of selection.

c) For Category-1 events all judges must be chosen from the list and be of different nationalities.

d) For Category-2 events:

i) *where three or four judges are to be used*, a maximum of two judges may be of the same nationality, *where five judges are to be used a maximum of three judges may be of the same nationality.*

ii) if using four or five judges, a minimum of three judges ~~have to~~ **must be selected from the official FAI list**

iii) if using three judges, a minimum of two judges ~~have to~~ **must be selected from the official FAI list**

iv) the remaining judges should be experienced and recommended by the organiser of the Category-2 event.

e) For subjective judging, a proportion of the judges chosen to judge at a Championship must not have judged at the previous equivalent championship. This proportion to be defined in the class rules.

Note:

Additional text in blue to make the selection of judges fair for all competitions particularly those for new world cup classes which are to be held outside of mainland Europe. Change “have to” to “must” as this is an instruction not a request.

17.2 Additional Bureau Proposals

Volume CIAM General Rules, Section 4A

INTRODUCTION TO FAI SPORTING CODE SECTION 4

FAI Sporting Code Section 4 contains the rules and regulations for FAI recognised activities in model aircraft and space models. These regulations are the responsibility of the FAI

Aeromodelling Commission (CIAM) and complement the General Section of the FAI Sporting Code which contains the rules and regulations common to all FAI activities.

Section 4 is split into Volumes to ease downloading the regulations for specific activities.

Present Volume "CIAM General Rules" gives the general rules for CIAM activities and events.

The dedicated Volumes contain all specific information for the activity concerned: rules for official and provisional classes, World Cup rules, and guides for organisers and judges. There are also dedicated **Volumes for Records and Electronic Devices used in Competitions (EDIC)**.

CIAM INTERNAL REGULATIONS

4. Permanent or Temporary Working Groups established by the Plenary Meeting or Bureau and responsible to the Plenary Meeting or the Bureau (see FAI Statutes 5.1.2.5).

a. **EDIC (Electronic Devices used In Competitions)** is a permanent **CIAM Working Group** which is responsible for any electronic device used in competition and described in the Sporting Code. The **WG** mission is:

- To issue technical specifications for all electronic devices used for CIAM competitions, after a request from CIAM Bureau or CIAM S/C Chairmen.
- To communicate with companies which are willing to manufacture such electronic devices.
- To define the approval procedure and the necessary steps in order to evaluate such devices.
- To test the devices according to the procedures defined.
- To issue and maintain an approval list of all such devices.
- To provide advice, to CIAM, on any matter relating to electronic devices that are used or can be used for aeromodelling or space modelling competitions.

CIAM GENERAL RULES FOR INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

FAI SPORTING CALENDAR

~~d) Eurotour contests for which registration has been received by the FAI Office after 15th November of the year immediately preceding the year of the contest may be added to the FAI Sporting Calendar but only with the written approval of the relevant Subcommittee Chairman.~~

Reason: When this rule was introduced there were a lot of events that were not properly registered to the calendar. Today this is not the case so this rule is not needed any more.

~~e) The Bureau has the right at any time to remove any event from the FAI Sporting Calendar if, in the opinion of the Bureau, the organisation would not appear to be up to the~~

~~expected standard. The President will ensure that all NACs are informed.~~

Reason: The FAI Sporting Code General Section has different provisions so this rule is in contradiction with the GS. Especially when there is an OA signed.

C7.1. FAI Jury

~~Note: FAI Sporting Code General Section 5.4.2.7 states that:~~

~~– the FAI Jury will cease its functions after it has given its decision on all protests which have been correctly made.; if no protests are outstanding, it shall not cease its function until the time limit set for the receipt of protests following the last task;~~

~~– the last action of the FAI Jury is to verify and approve the results of the contest and declare the event valid.~~

Reason: There is no need to include parts from the GS which might be no longer valid and may cause conflicts.

CIAM Bureau was informed by DAeC about the new regulation for explosives which is affecting the activity. It was decided the CIAM 1st VP Mr. Bruno Delor who is also an EMFU VP will inform the EMFU Board in order to consider the necessary actions via Europe Airports, the dedicated body in Europe for such matters.

The changes of Judges about the 2018 FAI F4 Wch for Scale Models EChs have been discussed and agreed as an interim decision. It will be published in the next bulletin.

Drones Matters

20 F3U – FPV Racing Volume considerations

Mr Delor informed the Bureau about the recent changes that were discussed and brought forward for approval by the S/C. He mentioned also that the members are contributing to the works of the S/C and he is quite happy for that. He insisted to keep the status of the class as is because it is developing quite fast and we need to be both flexible and proactive.

21 Drone Sport development within FAI from 2019 and on

Mr Delor presented a power point presentation which will also be presented at the Plenary regarding the way the Drone events will take place from next year. The World Cup events will remain as is but the winners will have the opportunity to participate in regional events which will be called Masters events (like tennis) and then the winners of those events will have the opportunity to participate in the final event which will be similar to a World Championship. He mentioned also that this scheme was also discussed between FAI and Lagardere Sports, a sport agent and they are also in agreement with that.

Mr. Delor asked if there are any objections from the Bureau side for that. CIAM President thanked Mr. Delor for the hard work he did and then he asked the Bureau members if they have any objections or some other ideas. No comments were expressed. So CIAM President asked Mr. Delor to include this Bureau decision to his presentation for the Plenary.

22 2018 Drones World Championships and future ones

Mr. Delor mentioned that in the last General Conference it was announced that the 1st Drone Racing FAI World Championships will take place in November at Shenzhen, China. There was an evaluation working group established including persons from FAI EB and CIAM Bureau and there were 3 bids properly submitted. The most complete was the one from Shenzhen so why it was selected. In addition a trip to Shenzhen was scheduled and it happened early in January and there is going to be a test event in May.

23 Ruling Authorities and future considerations (Annexes 1 to 4)

Mr. Delor explained the new rules which were developed by EASA for Europe and the procedures that have to be followed until they turn to be in effect.

24 Drones Permit to participate concept.

The CIAM President mentioned that the FAI EB decided to extend for one more year the decision taken last year with which it will be possible to participate in a CAT 2 drone event without an FAI SL but with this special Permit to Participate scheme. It is a similar procedure to obtain it like the FAI SL but it can be requested by the competitor and not the NAC but it is having a limited period. This concept will assist competitors from NAC were still the drones are not introduced officially to participate only in FAI Cat2 events.

Mr. Peter Halman mentioned that this new scheme is not well accepted by BMFA and there are going to be some problems for the competitors who will not have a regular FAI SL if they want to participate in the trials for the World Championships.

25. UAV Records

Mr Metkemeijer referred to the new Section 12 volume and the way the Working Group worked to develop this. It is an item on the agenda and the Plenary will decide about. CIAM President asked him if he is of the idea that the WG will be needed in the future or we will have to terminate it. Mr. Metkemeijer replied telling that we will need it so it was decided to extend the term for one more year with the same members.

26. Name of the S/C and the World Cup.

Mr Delor mentioned that after a discussion with the CIAM President they both consider that the existing name of this activity is rather limiting. Then he announced that there is the idea to name this activity as Drone Sport and also to change the name of the World Cup accordingly. Then he mentioned that CIAM President recommended changing the designation code from F3U which is also limited to F9 which will refer to this activity solely. CIAM President asked if there are any objections on that. It will be better to Metkemeijer's referred to the new Section 12 volume and the way the Working Group worked to develop this. It is an item on the agenda and the Plenary will decide about. CIAM President asked him if he is of the idea that the WG will be needed in the future or we will have to terminate it. Mr. Mett replied telling that we will need it so it was decided to extend the term for one more year with the same members.

27 Any other

28 F5J Intertour using FAI rules and Logo (item 23.1 of Dec Bureau Meeting)

CIAM President informed the Bureau members about the discussions that have so far been exchanged between Mr. Bahrati from Intertour, NAC of Slovakia and FAI (FAI Secretary General and him). It seems that Mr. Bahrati considers that F5J is somehow belonging to his team and it seems also that he is not so willing to accept the FAI rules and the way the events which are tied with Intertour, to follow the common standards as any other FAI CAT2 events. He mentioned also that there is going to be a meeting during the Plenary between Slovakian delegate, FAI Secretary General and himself so to find a common acceptable solution. If this will not be the case unfortunately FAI will have to take some actions in order to protect this intellectual property.

29 How to award championships that are missing approval from the Plenary Meeting

A proposal prepared by the bureau is part of the agenda so no further actions are required.

30 Judges for World Cup Events

After the extensive discussion during the December Bureau meeting and the emails exchanged, F3 Helicopters S/C Chairman Mr. Wolf presented a proposal which is included on the agenda as a Bureau proposal. No further actions are required.

31 F2C Noise Plan Development

Before the discussion of this item CIAM President mentioned about the emails he received from many interested parties for this matter. F2 S/C chairman Mr. Halman mentioned that he too received a lot of emails and there was also a proposal from the S/C member Mr. Bill Lee (USA) to find a way to use skype for the technical meeting. As he mentions he believes that this is not possible not only for technical reasons but also because there isn't any such provision so far in the rules. Going back to the core of this topic he mentioned that there are two proposals on the table for discussion during the Technical meeting tomorrow and also those proposals are supported by items on the agenda. So he hopes that a final proposal will be on the table for discussion and approval by the Plenary. Already part of the Bureau proposals to be discussed at the Plenary Meeting.

A proposal by the US Technical Expert Mr. Bill Lee to use Skype for the Technical Meetings was also commented by the F2 S/C Chairman. He mentioned that this method is not so efficient and it will cause a lot of delays.

32 Rule Revision for F2B circle

F2 S/C chairman asked that this topic to be moved for the December Bureau Meeting. Bureau members accepted this proposal.

38 Status of official classes with championships with no events

CIAM Bureau decided, implementing **C.14.2 Maintaining championship status**, to propose to the Plenary to remove class F3M (odd years) from the current list of classes with championship status (odd years).

39 Comments and improvement to the CGR volume

No comments were received. A new template is going to be received by FAI HO to be used on every FAI document. As soon as we receive this we will estimate the effort needed to switch to the new format.

40 Safety guidelines for CIAM General Rules considerations (item 32 of December Bureau meeting).

The WG established discussed the case via emails or Skype. Now CIAM President will work together with AMA President Mr. Hanson to deliver till December a draft copy of this new document.

41 Cat 1 Events Evaluation process

CIAM President mentioned that he will prepare a form for proper evaluation of the CAT1 events. It will be discussed in December.

It is announced that the December Bureau meeting may take place in Ankara so that the Bureau members will have an opportunity to visit the WAG venue. This will be confirmed later on by the FAI HO. Possible dates November 30 to December 1st. The Plenary meeting dates will be confirmed by FAI HO.
