




2.1 Name address of the airfield – Potchefstroom Airfield (The home of Jonker Sailplanes)

- 2.6.3 Usually for a National championships hosted here, we have 6 tow planes. However, we would most likely up that number to 8-10 tow planes. We usually aim for 1 tow plane per 6 gliders
- 2.6.4 Meteorological facilities that will be provided The usual meteo facilities are available.
- 2.6.5 Parking facilities for glider Some hangars, but plenty of space for tie downs.
- 2.6.6 Repair facilities for gliders Jonker Sailplanes Factory
- 2.6.7 Repair facilities for radios and instruments Jonker Sailplanes Factory
- 2.6.8 Oxygen requirements and supply facilities, if required Yes more than sufficient supply at Jonker Sailplanes
- 2.6.9 What plans do you have to implement the FAI Environmental Code of Conduct during your event? We strive to be Eco Friendly in all aspects of what we do. We currently run our airfield on Solar Power.

2.7 Airfield Infrastructure

- 2.7.1 Briefing Room & suitable equipment The local gliding club hangar will be converted into the briefing facility.
- 2.7.2 Common Room(s) for the competitor Local Gliding Club Club house will be used.
- 2.7.3 Suitable meeting Room for the International Jury and Stewards Jonker Sailplanes will offer office space.
- 2.7.4 Bar and or restaurant A facility will be setup on the airfield to accommodate, however the town is 10 minutes away with many options.
- 2.7.5 Press Centre TBA
- 2.7.6 Communication and internet equipment There will be internet on the airfield.
- 2.7.7 Post and Banking Available in town.
- 2.7.8 Insurance availability TBA but should be no issue. Many contaienrs are shipped to SA every year with foreign gliders.
- 2.7.9 Toilets, wash rooms and shower rooms There are facilities on the airfield, more will be hired in.
- 2.7.10 Car parking Ample space for parking.
- 2.7.11 Emergency (including fire) Local town services are available .
- 2.7.12 Medical and First Aid There is a private hospital at the entrance to the airfield, and they will be alerted of the event to have extra capacity on standby. There will be basic first aid facilities available on site.
- 2.7.13 Conference and office rooms for the OSTIV Congress, if required Jonker Sailplanes/ The Local gliding club will provide space for this if needed.
- 2.7.14 Competition office hours TBA.
- 2.7.15 Social event planned during the event Game Drive/Bush barbeque in the local wildlife farm only 20minutes from the airfield. (They have Rhinos and many wild animals.)
- 2.7.16 Availability of water for ballasting yes, with many back up water tanks.

- 4.4 Airspace in the task area Johannesburg airspace to the east, and some airways around, but for the most part up to FL195 is possible.
- 4.5 Typical tasks to be expected Racing Tasks usually, to the North West

6 Entry Fee

- 6.4 Rental cars Available at OR Tambo Airport, as well as local branches
- 6.5 Accommodation (as appropriate for local facilities) Plenty of local accommodation. University, also has large facility, that could possibly host many of the pilots.
- 6.6 Hotels Mostly Bnb's, but some small hotels also around.
- 6.7 Apartments Some university accommodation available.
- 6.8 Bed and Breakfast Plenty
- 6.9 Camping (as per note above) Will be made available on the airfield.
- 6.10 Catering TBA
- 6.11 Restaurants Plenty within the city. Over 20.

7 Glider Hiring (provide information on the following)

- 7.1 The availability of local gliders for hire Many will be made available, however over this period, many high performance gliders are shipped to Namibia, so can be flown or driven across the border as well. As well as gliders can be shipped to Potch. For European winter. Also gliders being produced by the Jonker Sailplanes factory can be held back for the event. Usually producing 3-4 per month.
- 7.2 The costs of hire (as per note above) Normal European rates depending on the aircraft.
- 7.3 Any restrictions on hire (e.g., license requirements) Validations can be arranged by the organisation .
- **8** Glider Import (provide information on the following)
- 8.1 Ports or cities of entry Shipped to Port Elizabeth or Durban. Jonker Sailplanes manages this logistics all the time, and can facilite.
- 8.2 Customs requirements Normal.
- 8.3 Customs brokers Jonker Sailplanes has agents.
- 8.4 Estimated costs and fees, including cost of transport of containers Same as usual.

9 Training

9.1 Provide details of any proposed training opportunities for teams and individuals prior to the Championships. (please note that if you organise training competitions, these cannot be called pre-World Championships or pre-European Championships)

These will be arranged leading up to the event. The South African nationals are usually held during a similar time at the same airfield so pilots, could come to fly any of these comps to practise in the years leading up to the event.

10 Trackers

10.1 Give details of which tracking system is to be used during the contest. Note that it is expected that IGC trackers will be hired as 1st preference.
OGN Stations will be setup to cover most of the task area, however IGC trackers may be used if required.

11 Miscellaneous

- 11.1 Visa Provide relevant information EU and US citizens do not require a visa to visit. For the rest, Visa's are easy to attain.
- 11.2 Licence Advise any special licence requirements? E.g., Instructions in case of a validation is needed. Pilots flying foreign gliders can fly with their foreign licences. Pilots flying South Africa registerd gliders, would need validations, which can be arranged in advanced and collected on arrival.
