9. REPORT ON FAI ACTIVITIES

Mark Sullivan, CIA President, reported on FAI activities and meetings and stressed out the working together of the commission's presidents.

10. FAI SECRETARY GENERAL'S REPORT

Markus Haggeney, FAI Secretary General, presented his report with the following points:

FAI and CIA Activities Report

Overview of FAI and CIA activities, including monthly bureau meetings and commission presidents' gatherings.

Mention of upcoming meetings to discuss special reserve accounts and training for officials and jury members.

Upcoming Election and In-Person Meeting

The next election will be in November this year in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, following the first inperson meeting since 2019, held in Dayton, Ohio in 2023.

The meeting aimed to restart activity levels and energy in airsport.

Financial Matters and FAI General Conference

More than 50% of the general conference focused on financial matters, with a call to shift the focus to the beauty of airsport.

Financial reports showed a positive variance for 2024.

Impact of Geopolitical Decisions

Geopolitical decisions led to an expected budget impact and potential drop in membership fees. The majority supported the removal of rights to avoid politicization and preserve FAI's integrity.

Importance of World Games

The World Games is a significant global event, providing opportunities for sports not included in the Olympic Games.

Participation in the World Games can lead to substantial financial support for federations.

Leadership Improvement

There is a call for more active leadership and improved communication within the organization. The need for better engagement and visibility, especially with the next generation of global leaders, was emphasized.

Need for Better Promotion of Air Sports

There is a need to improve the promotion of air sports to address misconceptions and showcase the positive impact on the environment.

The organization should actively share success stories and expertise.

Transparency in Financial Matters

There is a need to clarify the purpose and management of reserves, with a focus on reinvesting

in air sports.

The organization is working on a concept to differentiate running costs from investment activities.

Office Cost Reduction Efforts

The office has successfully reduced fixed costs by half a million per year since 2019.

Financial Collaboration and Trust

Trust and collaboration in financial matters were highlighted as crucial for the success of the commission.

To approve the modified wording in the CIA document documents FAI FIRST CATEGORY EVENT BIDDING AND SANCTION PROCEDURES Version 8.0 / March 20152018 and SC S1 Annex 7 – Section 3 as follows:

SECTION B - COUPE AERONAUTIQUE GORDON BENNETT

In accordance with the General Principles regulating the event (as amended at the CIA Meeting March 2010), this document specifies the requirements and deadlines that shall be met. These deadlines and requirements are based on the FAI Sporting Code and the Special GB Rules, as well as the relevant excerpts of the Sporting Code and Special GB Rules pertaining to the sanctioning process of the event.

Deadlines:

1.	November in the winning year	If the holder renounces the organization of the race, it should inform the FAI Secretariat within two months following the competition in which it was the winner.
2.	November in the winning year	The winning NAC must have their intention to bid – to organize the concerned Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett event – submitted to the FAI Secretariat within 60 days of the Jury declaring the event finished.
3.	June 30, in the following year	In case the winning NAC positively intends to bid, this NAC has a deadline of June 30th of that following year – about 14 month prior to the concerned event – to submit the bid. Ensuing/resulting bids, supported by the completed bid files, shall be received by June 30th of the intermediate bidding year unless these time limits are changed by the CIA under special circumstances.
4.	September 1 in the following year	The CIA Bureau to eventually grant the official CIA sanction approximately 13 months before the concerned event. The CIA is empowered to accept or reject bids to organise the Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett. Event Director, Safety Officer and Jury Members approved by the CIA Bureau
5.	March in the year of the event	Rules approved by the CIA Plenary Meeting

14. EVENT DEVELOPMENT SERVICE SC REPORT

Lindsay Muir (UK): reported on the work of the SubCommittee. They reviewed 2023 events and reviewed the current sanction applications.

Concerns were raised about the cancellation of the Women's World Championships in Brazil in 2025 due to funding issues.

On a motion from the Chair the Report was accepted unanimously

Motion 1:

With immediate effect, the AA Working Group will take over all the bidding requirements of the FAI Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett as detailed Section 3 of Annex 7 of Section 1 of the Sporting Code.

With immediate effect EDS will use the WatchMeFly platform for all Sanction Applications.

The motion is accepted unanimously

A discussion started on the use of the standby list in the invitation process to world and continental championships. It was considered to create a working group to clarify rules and create a flowchart for better understanding of the invitation process.

15. RECORDS SC REPORT

Troy Bradley (USA): reported on the work of the SC

No records have been ratified this year.

Notable flights need more attention, the SC will be working on that.

Record Observers do not need to be on-site in person for record attempts. Utilizing electronic media for tracking and proof of landing will lead to approval of recorded data. This change eliminates the cost and potential unreliability of on-site observers, offering more flexibility for record attempts.

On a motion from the Chair the Report was accepted unanimously

JC Weber (LUX): The physical badges used to be made in Luxembourg by a local jeweller, not existing anymore. We should look for a place where to make them.

Pilots are encouraged to pursue silver and gold badges and other achievements to promote teamwork and excitement in flying.

16. SAFETY AND EDUCATION SC REPORT

18.1. AA WORKING GROUP MINUTES

Marc Andre (SUI):

Discussion about the 23th and 24th GBR as well as the struggles in selecting a city for the 25th event in France.

Rule changes were also discussed, including minimum requirements for registration and about handling complaints from aviation authorities.

The purchase of hoses for the GBR was discussed, financed by the CIA.

There was a discussion about the sanction fee for the Gordon Bennett and the impact on potential sponsors.

A presentation held by Sebastian Eimers provided insights into the planning for the upcoming Gordon Bennett race in Münster (GER), including details about the launch field, trajectory, and schedule. A challenge was highlighted regarding the need to find an alternative launch field in case of high winds, potentially requiring a change in the launch field location. Future milestones like volunteer registration, budget securing, and merchandise planning were also discussed. Organizing event financing, particularly raising €250,000, was highlighted as a challenge, with the suggestion for the ballooning community to join Team Gordon Bennett for fundraising. Special pins are available for donation, contributing around €15,000 to the budget, offering benefits to donors.

Every event who is using it will pay 600 CHF technical fee to the CIA and 250 EUR for storage and maintenance to the club. The club is responsible for the maintenance and safety tests.

Because the Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett allows 3 competitors per NAC, the organizer cannot define a maximum number of competitors. The sanction fee for the Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett shall be defined as 1250 CHF flat.

18.2. AX WORKING GROUP MINUTES

Uwe Schneider (GER):

New communication possibilities, such as WhatsApp, nowadays are used to address task data changes and updates. A number of rules have been introduced regulating what information can be given until when via electronic channels to ensure safety and fairness for competitors.

A new respectful flying score system was proposed to discourage dangerous flying, with penalty points accumulating over two years and resulting in grounding if reaching a certain threshold. Concerns were raised about the system's implications, potential modifications, and its effectiveness in promoting safer flying practices.

Attachment 10 Proposal to invest up to 1000 CHF in implementing the respectful flying score into watchmefly.

Rule changes included dropping electronic marks when targets cease to exist and modifying landing proximity rules were proposed. A new Altitude Profile Task was discussed.

Renumbering of rules has been done to streamline references and remove unused rules.

Rules for the upcoming world championship have been submitted, checked, and found in order. Organizers and directors are willing to adapt the rules to AXMER2024.

To approve the changes to the AXMER2024 as presented.
